Pledge Educator – Steve Hall ‘09



SAE 2011 Task Force Housing Survey

This spring we will be rolling out a survey of the alumni and undergraduates for what is needed for the NYEP/LAE housing for 2011 and beyond. Several chapters around the SAE realm have built or renovated their chapter houses and have incorporated features for the needs of today's student and building codes. We are interested in finding out what aspects we all liked about the house and what dreams we have for an even better experience. SAE 2011 Task Force wants input

The housing task force has started its work, but we need more alumni feedback and support. The Maintenance and Renovation teams have contacts from other chapters around the realm and are working with SAE's Foundation and Housing, LLC to get guidance. Part of their direction will be set by feedback from the housing survey. The Finance/Alumni development team met in earnest Jan 27th and had initial ideas for phonathon development, getting a broader cross section of alumni back to alumni weekends, use of the Lion Fund, saving during this no mortgage period, developing school relations, and creating new alumni support mechanisms. Ways to Support NYEP while helping SAE and RPI

We have a Chapter Endowment Fund at National called the "Don Farkouh/Mark Hier Memorial Fund for New York Epsilon" that supports sending undergraduates to the National Leadership School. Currently it has \$6300 in it and has been somewhat stagnant for increases except for some LAE donations to it. We can use up to 6% each year for the scholarships, but it can't drop below \$5000. If you are thinking of donating to national, keep this fund in mind.

Greek Life at RPI can be supported (and it needs it) by earmarking a donation and your company match to "Dean of Students Office – Office of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs." The OFSA Dean is meagerly funded at \$4000 each year which is less than 1/10 the cost of one student to attend RPI. The AIGC hopes to expand this donation option much like the endowment funds that are available at Cornell and MIT.

Project to Find Lost Alumni

This spring the chapter will be working to find addresses and phone numbers for many of our recent alumni that we seem to have lost. In order for the phonathon to grow we need to keep in touch with our growing alumni base (> 800 strong now).
