NYEP Phonathon (April 1-3, 2012)



Last year was a hugely successful Phonathon with a grand total of \$49,880 received in donations (as of December 31, 2011). Due to the formation of the James Michael

Joly Zeal Fund, \$28,336 was donated by alumni and family and friends of James to create the foundation for this educational fund dedicated to funding SAE John O. Moseley Leadership School registration and other leadership programming. Some impact was expected for the previous donations to the general operating and other scholarship funds, but even so we surpassed \$21,400 for those donations. Brother Spotlight: Alex Morin

Alex Morin never intended to join a fraternity. As a freshman, he knew little about RPI's Greek life, and with track and his first year ahead of him, he decided against pledging to any particular house. As the year went on, he became good friends with Chris Chang and Justin Metzger. Both brothers were members of the RPI track team, and Alex got to know them well through the season. When sophomore year came around, Chang convinced Morin to check out the house during the annual Rush Luau. With such a good experience at the luau, Alex was convinced that SAE was right for him. "As I met more brothers, I realized how the fraternity worked and how close-knit the house was. It was something that I wanted to be a part of."

When asked about some of his best memories from SAE, he thought back to last summer during the LAE Retreat. Fifteen undergrads and five alumni spent a weekend at Wronsky's beach house in York, Maine. "Whether it was playing croquet, grilling lobster, or swimming in the frigid Atlantic, every minute of the weekend was spent having fun and becoming closer as friends and brothers."

Last spring, Alex had a particularly heavy course load, a position in the house as pledge educator, and a track season in full swing. Alex made the Dean's List as well as the Liberty league All-Academic, he and his team had a successful season, and the new pledges were initiated at the end of the semester and actively contribute to the house. Looking back, he acknowledges that he learned the importance of time management while at RPI. "It hasn't been easy, but learning to balance all of these activities has taught me a useful life skill that I hope to apply in all aspects of my life, both currently and in my future endeavors."

Specifically regarding the house, he has advice for the newly initiated brothers.

"I know it's a cliché, but my advice to the nibbles would be to get involved in the house early and often, because the more you put into the house the more you get out of it. So if you put time and effort into improving the house as a whole, it will pay off and provide for a better experience in the end."

Fortunately, in the week after his accident, he showed incredible signs of recovery and in honor of his recovery and to raise awareness for bicycle safety, the brothers of Sigma Alpha Epsilon collaborated with Alpha Phi and RPI cycling team to host a bike ride event eventually dubbed "Bike for Ben". The event was successful with almost 100 people in attendance; raising over \$850 all of which were donated to Troy Bike Rescue.

The same afternoon, our IFC Football team chose to wear the Bike For Ben T-Shirts as our jersey for the IFC Football Final. We unfortunately lost the 16-14, but it was definitely the closest game Pikes had seen all year.
