AAE Phonathon Results 2012

The 2012 phonathon results are in and as of the middle of August, we received \$21,171 from 132 donors. The top ten classes for participation rate and donations are included below. It is great to have 10 classes with more than $\sim 25\%$ participation and 8 classes donating more than \$1000. The new James Michael Joly Zeal Fund stands at more than \$32,000, while out other scholarships have reached \$118,000—all allowing us to send delegates to leadership school and help offset more than \$4000 in educational costs to the undergraduate brothers. Out Lion Fund for long term major house projects stands at more than \$115,000 and continues to be supported by investments each year from the general operating budget. This fund will be instrumental for the New York epsilon in the future as there are several fraternities on campus with major plans for renovations or rebuilds—including Sigma Chi taking action this fall. Finally, we continue to make annual expenses of more than \$40,000 per year for taxes, maintenance, and alumni relations.
